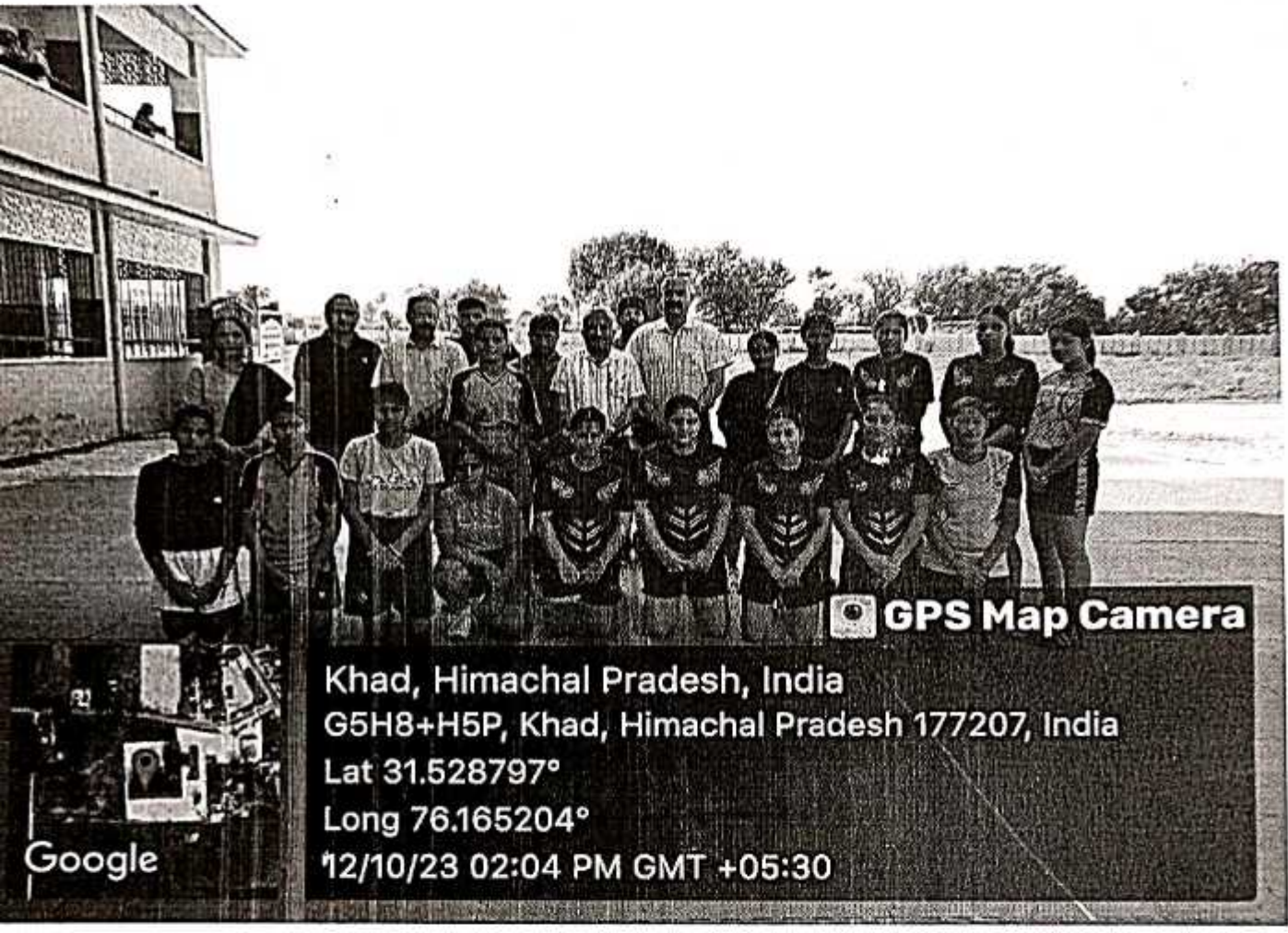

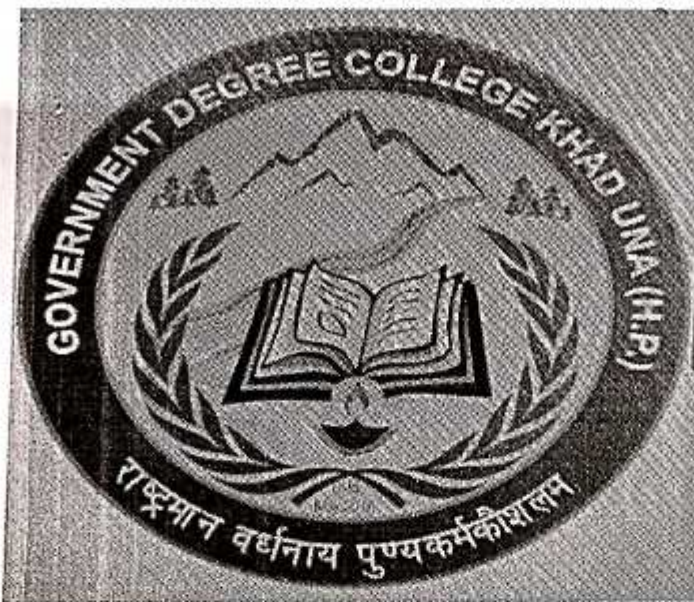

Section 2: Details about the College:**A. Vision Mission of the College:**

Vision of the College: **Empowerment through Knowledge**

Mission of the College: **To provide quality education through Core/Elective/Ability Enhancement/Skill Enhancement/Generic Courses thereby enhancing the ability of students to learn throughout the life**

B. Broad objectives of the College:

1. **Curricular aspects:** As per the H.P. Govt. Notification, our College has been granted approval for B.A. and B. Com. Programmes since its establishment in May 2016 and is affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. Curricular aspect is followed in true spirit by way of Annual System of RUSA (Rashtriya Uchhtar Shiksha Abhiyan), implemented from Academic Session 2013-14 in the State. Approval has been sought to start B.Sc. (Medical & Non-Medical), B. Sc. (Information Technology) along with new subjects in B.A; Geography, Journalism, Tourism, Sanskrit, & Physical Education.
2. **Teaching-Learning and Evaluation:** The College follows UGC Guidelines endorsed by Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh and Choice Based Credit System of RUSA (Rashtriya Uchhtar Shiksha Abhiyan) with regard to teaching-learning and evaluation. To make this process more effective, the students are encouraged to make use of computer, internet & NDLI facilities. Free internet/Wi-Fi is being provided in the library for the students. Stress is laid on fostering a sense of social responsibility, moral values and to tackle burning issues being faced in the society. Teachers are encouraged to attend seminars, orientation courses, refresher courses and short- term courses to keep their knowledge updated. To assess the headway made by the college, the head of the institution conducts regular meetings with the faculty members.
3. **Extension Activities:** Extension activities are carried through CSCA, NSS, NCC, Rover & Rangers, Road Safety Club, Red Ribbon Club, Career Guidance and Old Students' Association.

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4. **Strengthening Infrastructure and learning-Resources (ISR):**

At present, the college has a state of the art five- storey building. There are 06 airy and spacious ICT enabled smart class rooms, 04 ordinary class rooms, spacious Examination/ Multi-purpose Hall, Library (with Internet facility, photo-copier & Printer), free Wi-Fi on selected floors, Canteen, safe drinking water, sick Room , separate toilets for Boys & Girls and Persons with Disability, Girls Common Room, pantry room, store rooms, Gymnasium, multi-activity room and a Computer Lab. All rooms are equipped with LED tube- lights and fans. There is a proposal for setting up of a Conference Hall, Installation of Hybrid Solar Power/Backup Plant of minimum 25 MW, shed for Parking of Vehicles & Rainwater harvesting system.

5. **Student support and progression:** Scholarships, fee concession and welfare schemes are being provided to students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/EWS. Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are organized throughout the academic year to realize our vision and mission. Remedial classes are held for the students who are academically weak. The students are counselled in the beginning, during and the exit point to sort out challenges. To address complaints of the students, College constitutes various Grievance Redressal Cells. There is also a gymnasium for the physical fitness of the students in the College. We make best efforts to provide quality education for the all-round development of the students. The IQAC plays a pivotal role in assuring quality education.

6. **Governance, Leadership and Management:** The governance of the institution is reflective of and in tune with the vision and mission of the institution. The college assures efficient and effective implementation of the policies framed by the Department of Higher Education, Shimla. Various committees are formed to solve the problems of the students and effective management of the College in a decentralized manner. The Principal seeks opinions and suggestions of Staff, College Students Central Association (CSCA), Old Students Association (OSA) and Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) at various levels for the betterment of the College and academic environment and to sort out the grievances of students. The college reaches out to the poor and the underprivileged to extend all possible help. The IQAC discusses all the aspects of holistic education in the college to prepare students for the challenges of life.
