Your presence will definitely act as a catalyst for our future endeavours.

It is in all humility that I stand here in front of this august gathering, to present the consolidated account of diverse activities undertaken during the Academic Year 2023-2024.

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1. Introduction

"If you wish to invest for a lifetime, invest in Education." This is how a wise man has underlined the relevance of education in human life. The significance of this assertion must have been behind the journey that began with the conviction of the progressive community inhabiting village Khad. Successive generations of its natives have attained glorious heights in their chosen fields after venturing out of one of the oldest schools in the region. So, it is not an exaggeration to state that Govt. Degree College Khad is an extension of that dream which started with the foundation of a school, accentuating the importance of education. Opening an institution of higher learning had been a persistent demand of the people of the area for decades. It was during his visit to the Haroli Assembly segment that the then Chief Minister Sh. Virbhadra Singh acceded to the request made through Sh.Mukesh Agnihotri, who pleaded the cause with vigour and energy. The opening of the college was announced in May 2016 in a public meeting, and a notification followed in due course of time. An impressive function was organised to mark the foundation stone laying ceremony on 22 November 2016. Coincidentally, our Chief Guest of the day has been associated with the journey of this college at each stage, right since its inception. It occupies a special place in his heart. He has proven to be our staunchest ally during hour of need.

Situated on Una-Gagret Road, the college started functioning with induction of students in Arts and Commerce faculties. With a modest beginning of about a hundred odd students on rolls, Dr. Amarjeet K. Sharma, presently Director (Higher Education) was at the helm of affairs. Now the college has two hundred seventy odd students on rolls, majority of them girls. Many of these girls would not have been able to continue their higher education because of varied reasons. As you will witness during the course of this function, girl power has made its presence felt in almost every field and their parents and teachers can be justifiably proud of them.

2. Vision & Mission Statements

3. Infrastructure

The college embarked on its journey from the academic block provided by Pt. M.L. Dutt GSSS Khad that housed classrooms, administrative wing and a staff room. The arrangement, though temporary, lasted a span of almost seven academic sessions. The majestic building was inaugurated virtually by the then Chief Minister on 19 November 2021, but the possession was kept in abeyance due to some technical and administrative issues. After the formation of Government in 2022, the first deputy Chief Minister of the State, Sh. MukeshAgnihotri took initiative and accorded topmost priority to shifting of the college to its own campus. In his first public meeting after assuming office, he instructed various Government Departments to pull out all stops to ensure that the college is housed in its permanent campus before the year end. So, the college ushered in the year 2023 from its own permanent abode. The present building has ample space to fulfill the needs of an ideal institution of higher learning. There are six lecture theatres equipped with smart boards and facilities for virtual mode of teaching, five classrooms, provision for two computer labs, one multipurpose hall, a spacious library with a reading room, separate rooms for co-curricular and extension activities, with corridors wide enough to accommodate all; it is also worth mentioning that sufficient land is available to conform to future expansion plans.

With the shifting of the building, a gradual process of updation and up gradation of infrastructure has automatically been set in motion. Purchases have been made to meet the requirement of furniture, books, hardware and other miscellaneous items. Here also, the institution gratefully acknowledges the prompt response of Worthy Deputy Chief Minister's office and office of Worthy Director (Higher Education) in clearance of budgetary provisions for developmental works. The foundation stone for an indoor stadium at an estimated cost of Rupees 15 Crore was laid by Sh. MukeshAgnihotri on 9 September 2023. Construction work has already begun on the structure. Keeping in view the security aspect, CCTV with 31 cameras has been installed at a cost of Rs. 9,45,896/-, Sanctioned by the Hon,ble Deputy Chief Minister. The vision and planning of our worthy chief guest has certainly ensured that this college will rub shoulders with the best of the state in future.

Academics

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Academics constitute the major thrust area of any educational institution. The hard work of students is reflected in the results at the end of each session.

The college toppers have obtained outstanding grades in University exams.In order to assess and facilitate the preparation of the students for the final exams, the college conducts house examination, simulating the conditions on University pattern. Results for this session are as under:

Competitions in these games were held at Hamirpur, Sanjauli, Sri Jawalaji andChamba respectively. The college football team achieved a creditable first in the brief history of its existence by winning the trophy in an impressive display of skill and fortitude. Three members of the victorious team- Shameer Khan, Amandeep Singh and DilbarTopno- were selected to represent HP University in North Zone Inter-varsity Championship. This accomplishment deserves a special mention because of its enormity.

5. NSS

National Service Scheme unit was allocated during this academic session in the month of August, under the guidance of Dr. Arti, Programme Officer. Under regular activities, the unit organised Plantation Drive, Assistance in raising Disaster Relief Fund, Reuse of Plastic Waste under Swacchta Hi SewaAbhiyan, Awareness Rallies, Street Play, Shramdaan, AmrutKalashYatra, Fit India Freedom Run, Blood Donation Camp, Pot painting Competition etc.

Two volunteers, Ms. GurbakshKaur and Ms. Aditi, participated in the NSS Medha Camp w.e.f. 18 December 2023 to 22 December 2023 at Govt. CollgeBanjar, District Kullu. Ms. Aditi was further selected to represent the state contingent in the National Youth Festival at Nasik, Maharashtra, and earned commendation for her performance in cultural activities.

The 7 day special NSS Camp was conducted from 23 February 2024 to 29 February 2024 in the college campus. 50 volunteers registered their active presence in the camp. Various social, educational, cultural and fitness activities were organised during this camp. Volunteers carried out a cleanliness Drive in the vicinity of Shiva Temple, Hanuman Temple and College campus. Experts from diverse areas, notably Sh. Rajesh Sharma Manager PNB Saloh, Dr. Raj Kumar Asso. Professor GDC Una, Dr. AnjuPathak GDC DaulatpurChowk, Dr. Babita General Physician, shared valuable information with the volunteers.

6. NCC

NCC (Army Wing) unit was allocated to GDC Khad in August 2023, with a sanctioned intake capacity of 50 cadets. AP Lakhbir Singh is looking after the regular activities as caretaker till his impending training as ANO later. The strength in its first year was 13 whereas 19 cadets joined in second year.

Library is one of the most important components of any educational institution. Serious efforts have been made to enrich the library with reading resources and facilities to encourage the young minds towards making it their favourite space during leisure hours. A grant of Four Lakh INR was utilised to procure reference and general books. Presently there is a total stock of 1032 books -254 of general nature and 778 reference books. Almirahs, book racks and reading tables, purchased out of the liberal grants made by Directorate of Higher Education on the recommendation of office of Hon'ble Deputy CM has enhanced the academic ambience. Besides, members of the staff have contributed by donating their personal books to the Book Bank. Daily newspapers, magazines and journals have been subscribed to as well. The college library is associated with National Digital Library of India(NDLI) as a club member, and avail access to digital educational resources.
